



Physical Education Intent:

At the Newlands Federation we strive to provide a high-quality physical education and a broad range of physical opportunities, to ensure that all children develop physical fitness, stamina, and skill. It is vital that our children understand the importance of physical activity and sport in developing a healthy mind and body. We provide a wide and diverse range of physical opportunity across the curriculum, from Nursery to Year Six, so that all children make a positive connection with physical activity, be this in a PE lesson, through competitive sport, in the Forest or on the playing fields. It is our hope that this love for and understanding of our physical selves will last a lifetime.

Achievements to Date:

- Improved outdoor environments at Clandon and across the Federation.
- Implementation and development of Forest School sessions at Clandon.
- Increased teacher confidence through sports coaching.
- Catch up additional swimming provision in KS2.
- Improved resources and storage.

Grant Criteria:

Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officers guidelines recommend that primary school pupils undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.

Key indicator 2: The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

Priorities for 2021-22

1. Raise the profile of sport and physical activity across the school, in particular the link between physical activity and physical and mental wellbeing.
2. Make best use of the Federation to invest in and make best use of high quality staff, resources and environments.
3. Increase the confidence of all staff in the teaching and supervision of primary sport.
4. Ensure all children have the opportunity to take part in at least one hour of physical activity each day.
