#### **Dear Families**

We hope you all had a wonderful Easter break. Thank you to those who came to help tidy up the playground and communal areas on the first Saturday of the holiday. Your help was really appreciated, and it was nice to come back to a tidy school at the start of term.

#### **School Uniform:**

Thank you to those who have taken the time to offer feedback on the uniform list sent just before the holiday. We understand this has caused some confusion and complications, so we have taken on board your comments. On the previous uniform list children in Key Stage One were required to wear more formal uniform, i.e., grey trousers, skirts and summer dressers. This is now not the case, however if you have previously purchased this uniform, it is fine for your child to continue wearing it.

On PE (Physical Education) and Forest School days children may still come to school dressed ready for these activities, **there is no need to bring school uniform in their bags unless you feel this is needed.** The **revised** uniform list is available at the end of this letter and also on our website Clandon C of E School - School Uniform.

Brigade – the school uniform supplier is offering a 10% discount on all uniform orders placed next weekend – Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> April. You will need to enter SPRING23 at the checkout to activate this discount.

Brigade have also asked us to let you know that the **last date for uniform orders for delivery to school** before the end of this term is **Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> June**. The service will switch to home delivery from Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June until Friday 15<sup>th</sup> September.


#### **Important eSafety Update:**

Keeping our children safe online is an ongoing challenge as technology is continuously changing and it can be difficult to keep up. This week, a parent has brought our attention to an app called Discord which is a free app allowing users to communicate via text, video and voice. The logo is child-friendly and if you're not aware of the app it could be easy to overlook it, but there is potential for your child to communicate with unknown users via the platform putting them at risk of receiving inappropriate content. We've attached an information sheet to this newsletter so that you can find out more if you wish to.

We know that some of our children already have access to WhatsApp (which has a guidance rating of 16+ in the UK and Europe) so have also attached the information sheet for this app which includes guidance on settings you can alter to make it safer to use. Please do take the time to read this if you have allowed your child to use WhatsApp and check your child's settings.

# What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

Discord is a free app which allows users to communicate in real time via text, video or voice chat. Available on desktop and mobile devices, it was originally designed to help gamers cooperate – but has evolved into a more general networking platform for a range of online communities, discussing topics like TV series, music, Web3 and more. Discord is organised around closed groups, referred to as 'servers'. To join a server, users must be invited or provided with a unique link. It's a space for users to interact with friends, meet others with shared interests and collaborate privately anline — but it's also a place where young people can be exposed to risks if the right precautions aren't taken.

# Advice for Parents & Carers

#### REVIEW SAFETY SETTINGS

Discord has a series of safety settings, enabling users to choose who can direct message them or send them friend requests. Your child's experience on Discord will be much safer if the appr's privacy and safety settings are configured to only allow messages or friend requests from server members. This will minimise the chances of potential predators from outside the group cantacting them.

#### MONITOR ONLINE ACTIVITY

It's wise to regularly review your child's activity on Discord. This can include checking their safety settings to ensure they're carrectly enabled, talking about which servers they've joined and reviewing some of their friends and direct messages. Ask if anything has made them feel uncomfortable or unsafe. Things can change quickly online, so plan routine check-ins and follow up frequently.

# **EXPLAIN AGE FILTERING**

While Discord requires users to be at least 12 to sign up, many servers geared towards older users are flagged as NSFW (not safe for work), which indicates they probably contain material that's inappropriate for children. It can be easy to click through settings without properly reviewing them, so ensure your child understands why age liltering is important and that it's there to protect them.

# DISCUSS GOOD ONLINE BEHAVIOUR

The anonymity affered by the internet often leads people to communicate more openly online and behave differently than they would at school or home. It's crucial to bear in mind, though, that every internet user is still a real person. Talk to your child about the severe and justing consequences that cyberbullying or exchanging inappropriate material online can have in the real world.

# SCREEN OUT EXPLICIT CONTENT

In the privacy and safety settings.
Discord users are offered the ability to filter direct messages for inappropriate content a setting that should be enabled if your child uses the platform. Discord automatically tries to flag images that are explicit, but the setting must be manually enabled for text. If a young user is sent explicit content in a direct message, Discord will scan and (if necessary) delete it.

#### HAVE CANDID CONVERSATIONS

It can sametimes be awkward to discuts topics like grooming, parnagraphy, racism or explicit content with your child – but it's important to ensure they're aware of the harms these things can pose. Talking openly about these subjects is a great way to help your child feel more comfortable about coming to you if they experience an unwanted encounter on Discord (or anywhere else online).

# **CLANDON SCHOOL UNIFORM**

Please ensure all items of clothing are named.

### Early Years and Key Stage One

Clandon logo sweatshirt or cardigan\*
White polo shirt (optional)
Black, grey or navy joggers, leggings or shorts
Grey or white socks or tights
Black trainers

EYFS and KS1 children need a Clandon logo bookbag\* and a named water bottle in school every day.

### **KEY STAGE 2 – Years 3, 4, 5 and 6**

Clandon logo V-neck knit jumper or cardigan \*
White button-up shirt (long or short sleeved) or white polo shirt
School tie \* (optional)
Plain grey trousers long or short, skirt or pinafore
Light blue check summer dress or grey skirt, pinafore or shorts with white polo shirt
Grey or white socks or tights | Black shoes

KS2 children need a small rucksack and a named water bottle in school every day.

**Black, closed, flat-soled shoes are suitable for school:** open toe sandals, sling backs and trainers (unless for PE) are not suitable.

**Long hair must be tied back:** to help prevent the spread of headlice.

No jewellery to be worn to school: only small stud type earrings for pierced ears. No earrings on PE days.

# PE all years (EYFS, KS1 and KS2)

Clandon logo PE t-shirt \* | Blue tracksuit bottoms
Navy blue or black shorts | Blue tracksuit top
Plimsolls | Trainers
(Clandon logo PE bag \* available)

#### **FOREST SCHOOL**

Correct clothing is essential and needs to be appropriate for all weather conditions. Tops and trousers must fully cover the skin to prevent nettle stings and other irritations, insect bites and ticks.

#### **WINTER**

Long trousers and long-sleeved top
Wellingtons or sturdy walking boots
Jumper or sweatshirt
Waterproof coat and trousers
Hat, gloves and thick socks
Named water bottle

#### **SUMMER**

Long trousers and long-sleeved top (No shorts or tshirts) – in hot weather clothes can be lightweight but must fully cover the skin Trainers and long socks to cover lower leg Sun hat, sun cream and insect/tick repellent Named water bottle
