


#### **Athlete Event:**

As you will know, we informed the children last Friday that Victoria Ohuruogu would be visiting us on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October to talk to the children about her journey as an athlete and to lead the children in completing a fitness circuit to raise money for both our school and for SportsforSchools. Unfortunately, Victoria has had to pull out of her visit due to the

demands of her Olympic training schedule, so yesterday we revealed to the children which athlete will be visiting instead and they were very excited to hear it will be Courtney Orange.

Courtney is from Zimbabwe and took up gymnastics at 7 years old. Courtney began pursuing his Olympic dreams in London and competed in the 2002 Commonwealth Games, before a knee injury forced him to quit his professional career as a gymnast. He was then discovered by talent scouts as a fantastic dancer and went on to perform on stage for top music stars. Courtney now enjoys working as a wellbeing



motivator. Courtney's motto is: "You grow through what you go through" and we hope his messages about overcoming adversity will very inspiring. All the children should have brought home a sponsorship form but we have lots of spares in the office if anyone needs a replacement.

### eSafety Spotlight - Guided Access:

One of our parents has shared how useful 'guided access' is when allowing her children to use her phone, so we thought we would share this with our parent community in case you're unaware of this feature. On an iPhone or iPad, you can turn guided access on by going to Settings>Accessibility>Guided Access. These settings allow you to restrict the user to a single app, control which app features are available and set a time limit.
