#### **Dear Families**

With only one more week to go until half-term, we've managed to pack in rather a lot this week!

#### **Health and Safety Update:**

This week school leaders completed our annual health and safety audit which will now be reviewed by our Governors. Completing this audit every year helps us to ensure we have completed all our statutory duties and necessary checks, so it is always a useful exercise in the first half term of the new academic year.

With Health and Safety in mind we would like to ask for your support. If you spot anything on any school site that you feel is unsafe then please report this to our Premises Manager, Mr. Frank Carthy – <a href="mailto:frank.carthy@clandon.surrey.sch.uk">frank.carthy@clandon.surrey.sch.uk</a> or directly to the school office. Issues such as trip hazards, broken equipment or dead branches are easily spotted when many eyes are looking up, down and all around with health and safety in mind.

#### Food Bank at St Peter and St Paul Church:

We thought it helpful to send a reminder about the 'take what you need – leave what you can' food bank at our local church. This can be accessed any time the church is open (most days) and is anonymous. Father Barnaby would like our community to know that they can access this resource if they are in need and would also be grateful for any donations from families who feel they have enough to share.

#### **Kestrels Visit to Henley Fort:**

On Wednesday, Kestrels spent the day at Henley Fort to consolidate their learning focus on the World Wars. They each had a turn at dressing up as World War 2 Home Guards and Air Raid Patrol (ARP) Wardens - check out the photos over the page. They learned that many 'real-life' Home Guards were trained at Henley Fort during the Second World War in the same room that the children were being 'trained' in. As ARP Wardens they learned how to put out fires and how to black out windows ready for an air raid. As Home Guards they created road blocks and learned how to check identify cards before practising throwing cricket ball 'grenades'. It was a fascinating and informative visit. #### Our Visit from Courtney Orange:

You may well have some very tired children this evening following our hugely successful athlete visit and sponsored fitness circuit! The children completed a circuit of *spotty dogs*, *leg drives*, *push ups* and *star jumps*, accompanied by some energising music. The children awaiting their turn were fantastic at cheering on their peers. Lots of the staff team came in sports kit ready to take part too and the children were impressed to see them participating.



After the sponsored event, we all returned to the hall for an assembly with Courtney during which he talked about the impact that one of his teachers – Mrs Smith – had in inspiring him to train as a gymnast. He talked about the dedication required to train to National level in a sport and the mantra that got him through it: *I can do this*! We were all speechless when he showed us some of his gymnastic skills, especially the superman pose on his special 'I can do it' stool.





#### **Forest School Updates:**

You will have seen the email this week notifying you that the **Forest School Working Party** has been moved to **Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> November 10am-12pm**. We have also extended the invitation to parents from Shere School and we hope to have a bigger turn out so that we can get some much needed clearing done at the site. You don't need any special skills but do dress to get stuck-in and bring some sturdy gloves if possible. Owing to the nature of the work that needs to be done, we are not able to have child helpers for this working party.

The following week on **Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> November 10am-12pm** we are planning a **Forest School Open Morning**. We will be publicising this to prospective families for places in Reception and Year 3 next year, but the event is also open to current families as we know some of you

haven't had an opportunity to visit the site before. Children are welcome at this event but will remain the responsibility of their parents whilst visiting the site. Further details to follow when they're confirmed.

The weather continues to surprise us by staying warm, but we do now ask that you ensure your child has their **waterproof trousers**, **waterproof jacket and wellies** in school for their Forest School visits. Even when it isn't raining, the undergrowth and ground are now wetter so the children will need this protection in order to comfortably take part in all the activities on offer.



Finally, a huge thank you to Wayne for donating some guttering for the children to use at the Wilderness. They are developing their own water collection system and we're very excited to see what they build with this new equipment. We are always grateful for donations and would love more tubes, pipes and containers to add to this resource. We also need some more old cooking utensils (especially large spoons) and/or small spades/trowels for our mud kitchen on the school site.
