Dear Families

It was good to see so many of you for the Parent Teacher meetings on Wednesday. The teachers enjoyed the opportunity to share your child's learning and progress with you. If you were not able to attend your appointment on the day, please do get in touch with your child's class teachers to arrange another date.

Staffing Update:

Some of you will be aware that Ms Reynolds has been Interim SENCO since Mrs Saunders went on maternity leave near the end of the summer term. We are now pleased to announce that, from January, Mrs Cathy Hollis will be fulfilling the role of Federation SENCO across both Clandon and Shere. We are delighted to be increasing our capacity to support children who need additional and different provision and look forward to welcoming Mrs Hollis to Clandon in the new year.

Focus on Remembrance:

This week we have been preparing for our Remembrance observance this morning. The children have written poems and prayers and created beautiful crafts focusing on the poppy; that glowing symbol of remembrance as we thankfully recall those who have given their lives in war.









Start of the School Day:

School gates are open from 8.45 to 8.55am. On arrival in the classroom, children get on with early work such as finishing off work, filing work, or a new piece of work and the teachers give information about the day ahead. This means that prompt arrival every day is very important – even a few minutes lateness causes children to miss important information. Registers are called at 9.00am and children arriving after this time up to 9.15am will be marked as late. Children who arrive after 9.15am will be coded as U on the register (late after registers close) which means the whole session for which they arrive late is classed as an unauthorised absence.

Forest School Open Morning:

A huge thank you to those who kindly gave their time last Saturday to prepare our Forest School site for the autumn and winter. It was a very wet morning but a lot was achieved.

Tomorrow, **Saturday, 11th November**, we are holding a Forest School Open Morning from **10.00am–12.00pm**. If you know any families currently looking for infant or primary school places do let them know about this event. Parents of current Clandon and Shere families, who are interested in finding out more about Forest School, are also welcome. The Wilderness is a wonderful resource that is regularly used and loved by the children and staff of Clandon and Shere Schools and we welcome this opportunity to share it with parents.



Focus on Forest School by Mrs Becky Saunders (Forest School Assistant):

What a wonderful return to our Forest School Wilderness since half-term! Across the school, children have been making full use of the opportunities to learn, grow and play at Forest School. Some have started to hone their woodcraft skills through sawing, wood splitting, hedgelaying and whittling (see the knives being made by Kestrels this week). Others have created log art using hammer, nails and yarn (see the tree made by a Kestrels pupil). Other seasonal crafts have included making spiders webs, conker spiders, and "god's eye" poppies. They've also enjoyed more campfire cookery - toasting sugared cinnamon apples. Speaking of campfires, some children have practiced using the "flint and steel" (see the sparks made by a Squirrels pupil!).

Besides all this, we've observed seasonal changes in our woodland as we are now well into Autumn – a treat for the senses with the changing colours of the leaves (Woodlands class children picked up on their classroom learning and noticed both evergreen and deciduous trees in our Wilderness), the sounds of raindrops and the wind, spotting a variety of fungi and the joys of mud play! As the weather gets ever wetter and cooler, we would ask that all children wear layers to keep warm, and bring waterproof coat, trousers and boots to school each week.

As ever we offer a familiar structured routine each session which includes a "mindful moment" and a talk about safety guidelines. Alongside this, we offer a selection of activities, as well as the usual ones like the swing, mud kitchen, trench digging, water play (using the fab new gutters that were generously donated to us) and, weather permitting, climbing tree. The children are encouraged to try new things, but ultimately, the choice is theirs and we are always delighted to see where their energy takes them!

We look forward to seeing those who have signed up at our Forest School Open Morning, from 10am tomorrow - an opportunity for you to experience our wonderful forest, with your children!
