
Winter Mini Challenge 2023 in Surrey Libraries:

Update on the Road Closure by Burnt Common Roundabout:

Thank you to Natalie Jones and Catherine Brindle for sharing this response regarding the road closure which may affect some journeys to school using the A247 ...

I am writing to provide further details of the UK Power Networks (UKPN) works taking place on the A247 Clandon Road, Send. These works involve the installation of an electrical supply to new domestic premises which are scheduled to be occupied shortly and include excavation of a trench for the new service connection, laying ducts, cables, jointing and reinstatement of the highway.

Although the information provided on one.network details this as a 'road closure' from 1st-17th December, these works are actually being completed in two stages to minimise disruption to traffic as much as possible. The **first phase** of these works is to commence from **1st-6th December** where two-way temporary traffic lights will control opposing traffic flows between 9:30 am to 4:00 pm every day with the road returned to full use in both directions outside of these times.

In the **second phase** of works a northbound (only) directional road closure towards Burnt Common Roundabout will be in place from **6th-17th December** to complete the duct and cable laying and make the final jointed connection onto existing supplies. This traffic management solution has been carefully considered. It is important to note that temporary traffic signals cannot be successfully deployed in close proximity of the roundabout where the final connection must be made, due to congestion along the opposing traffic flows and the risk of queuing traffic back to the A3 itself and the safety concerns this would raise. Please note that throughout Phase 2 of the works southbound traffic will be able to travel along the A247 unimpeded.

A fully signed diversion route will be in place taking drivers who reach the northbound closure point down the curved slip road onto the A3 to then travel south, coming off at the Burpham exit, passing Sainburys and rejoining the A3 via Clay Lane to travel north back to Burnt Common. Traffic seeking to travel north along A247 from the Clandon Crossroads will be diverted at the crossroads themselves, into Guildford along the A25 to join the A3 and travel north to the Burnt Common junction. Surrey Officers and UKPN are aware that some motorists may elect to use alternate narrow cross-country routes to travel around the point of A247 closure. However, due to the volume of traffic expected at rush hours, we do not encourage the use of these roads and signage will be deployed to warn of the unsuitability of such routes for all traffic.

We continue to liaise closely with UKPN and their contractors to minimise the impacts caused by these necessary works. Due to the large number of works in this area already scheduled for forthcoming school holidays along with the need to coordinate with the programme of works on the M25 Highways England Junction 10 project and other applications for essential works in the Send, Ripley, Ockham, East and West Horsley areas, several of them development driven, there are currently no other possible alternate dates available to carry out these necessary works prior to the date when the properties are to be occupied. Regrettably, the Traffic Management impact of the utility companies' connections works to development sites is not something ordinarily factored into the planning approval stage and so Surrey County Council must facilitate such works when appropriate in order to allow the permitted completion of the development and subsequent occupation of the premises.
